Fire Commissioner Jerry Craig has stepped down from position one of the Fire Commissioner Board effective December 31, 2007. Jerry was appointed to the position in the spring of 2002, to fill the vacancy created when then Commissioner Kevin Miller moved out of the District to Kennewick. RADIO CHANGES COMING

For the past five years the Fire District has been preparing for a major change in county wide radio transmitting and receiving. This is mostly due to the huge amount of cell phone use in the country. Many changes have also taken place in regards to radio frequencies since the terrorist

attack on the World Trade Center. I will not bore you with all of the details, many in which I do not understand myself, but here is what has happened:

There is a certain amount of radio spectrum available nationally. Emergency service is authorized to operate in a certain range of that spectrum. Cell phone providers negotiated with the FCC and ultimately purchased more radio spectrum or frequency capacity. Emergency services has been complaining for centuries that there was not enough to go around & more frequencies were needed for us. The trade off for emergency services was to migrate to a narrow band frequency width, giving us more frequencies and the ability to split them. Currently we operate in a wide band area of the frequency spectrum.

In short, the past two years the Fire District has budgeted closed to \$100,000 to change all of our radio systems over to narrow band. All purchases made in the last five years

have been compliant to the new capabilities. This year we received a grant for \$25,000 from the Washington State Department of Natural Resources to help cover the replacement cost of our portable and mobile radios. All the pagers used by our volunteers must be replaced, in order for them to be notified of emergencies.

Effective April 1st all upper valley fire radio communications will be on the new narrow band frequency. For all of you that keep track of the fire service on your scanner, the frequency will be 154.2575. Will your old scanner receive narrow band frequencies? Good question - I do not know. What I do know is it will end up costing about \$100,000 to make sure that all of our firefighters can hear and talk to one another.


